The 2019 Most Valuable Student Scholarship Contest is open to any high school senior who is a U.S. Citizen. Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need. The 2019 MVS application opened on August 15, 2018. The deadline for applications is November 15, 2018. To apply go to: https://www.elks.org/scholars/scholarships/MVS.cfm.

Eligibility:

- Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.
- Applicants need not be related to a member of the Elks.
- High school graduates are not eligible to apply.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are signed; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.

Awards:

- The Elks National Foundation will award 500 four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the 2019 competition.
- Male and female students compete separately.
- Ranging from \$1,000 to \$12,500 per year, Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students pursuing a 4-year degree, on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours) in a U.S. college or university. All scholarships are in the form of certificates of award conditional upon the full-time enrollment in an accredited U.S. college or university.
